(1) PEOPLE

- [a] Who do we worry about the most?
- [b] How do we keep track of their contact info?

Before, during, and/or after a disaster:

- [c] How will we share accurate situational info?
- [d] Who can help with communications?

TIP: Sign up for emergency alerts. (ex: local emergency management; city; Nat'l Weather Service)

Keep them active all year.

Encourage others to do the same.

- [c] What kind of disasters are we most concerned about? Our answer helps us determine what to prioritize.

(3) PROPERTY / FACILITIES

- [a] Where is our property insurance policy stored?
- [b] When does it get renewed?
- [c] Are we current?

TIP: Have your policy # and contact info easily accessible.


[d] Where is this stored for quick access?

TIP: A property inventory is the gold standard, but you could begin by storing photos of your facilities and physical assets in the cloud.

- [e] Where do we store utility contact and account info?
- [f] What else comes to mind about property protection?








(4) RECORDS & DATA SAFEGUARDING

- [a] What kind of data must we NOT lose in a disaster? What is irreplaceable?
- [b] What might we need access to?
- [c] How secure is our vital data? Is it in "the cloud?"
- [d] Where might we temporarily move vital <u>physical</u> records if our property might be damaged?
- [e] Where is our secure passwords list?
- [f] What else comes to mind?



(5) COMMUNITY OUTREACH

- [a] Who are our vulnerable neighbors?
- [b] Who are our community partners? Coalitions?
- [c] Who among us has strong community relationships?
- ex: with local gov't., local social services agency
- [d] What assets can we share with the wider community during or after the event?
- ex: People trained in Mental Health First Aid who can listen
- ex: Community meals or other hospitality
- ex: Electricity to charge cell phones
